
Christmas Greetings

hearts and minds and souls to be the people who live out the way that Jesus has shown us - for it is the only way that hope becomes real and peace is achieved.



We strongly agree that the website should be up-to-date, accessible and interactive to all users. And we're glad to say that the new website is nearing completion and is nearly ready for launch.
