Dear Friends,

I was recently reading through some quotes from Viktor Frankl, a Holocaust survivor and author of Man's Search for Meaning, when I came across a quote I found profoundly moving. It read, "We who lived in concentration camps can remember the men who walked through the huts comforting others, giving away their last piece of bread. They offer sufficient proof that everything can be taken from a man but

one thing: to choose one's attitude in any given circumstances, to choose one's own way."

I spent some time thinking about what I had read and the rays of light that shone from the men Frankl described and it reminded me of two things. It reminded me of Jesus; that Jesus chose this attitude even though it led to the Cross, and

it reminded me why I am a Christian, or, as I prefer, a follower of Christ. You see, I believe by following Christ we are transformed as human beings. I believe in Christ we get to see life through a different lens. I believe in Christ we are blessed with the strength to do the kinds of things that Frankl witnessed in the concentration camps - the presence of compassion and kindness and selflessness.

Some might argue that we don't need Jesus to help us be compassionate and kind and

selfless and I will not argue with them but as for me I know I need the presence of Christ in my heart in order to be the kind of person I believe God wants me to be. A long time ago when I was a youngster and thought about what lay ahead, my journey of life, I realised that I wanted to live a good life, a life that gave instead of just taking. I knew I could not endure on my own; that my actions would simply not be selfless, and in Jesus I saw one from whom I could draw strength. Jesus set an example for me that I desired to follow with all of my heart. He



changed my life. He allowed me to look outwards. He allowed me see others through different eyes; that if I ever was in a precarious place where I had choices to make, where I had to choose an attitude, it would be the attitude that Jesus displayed, that Jesus has shown me and taught throughout my life as one of his followers to give my bread away like those men in the concentration camps.

Ardeonaig weekend September 27-29

This is now fixed at the Abernethy Trust centre at Ardeonaig on Loch Tay. At the moment we have 33 people at least committed to going. The adult cost for

Behind the Wall Study Tour

John & Christine Hodge are taking part in the Church's World Mission Council study tour to Israel and Palestine at the end of March. It is led by Very Rev Andrew McLellan and Maureen Jack. The aim is to meet with Israelis and Palestinians and to find out what life is like for them, whichever side of the wall they are on. As you may be aware a big wall (or in some cases a fence) has been erected along the boundary between the Palestinian and Israeli areas. This causes all sorts of issues for those living there. In this case who pays for it is not the problem although there are many other issues arising.



The leaders are keen that we share with our congregations what we are doing. We were there 7 years ago but from what we hear the situation has got worse particularly for the Palestinian population. Our aim is to find out what the situation is and to listen to people on both sides of the wall so that we can understand better what is happening. We hope to be able to share our experiences with you on our return.

Scripture Union in Belarus

You may remember that Nikolai came and spoke at our monthly Saturday prayer meeting last year. He mentioned that one of their needs was for a dishwasher for the campsite. One member in particular felt moved to help with this appeal and others followed her lead. As a result we were able to send £823 to assist with the purchase of a dishwasher. We have recently received an email:-

"Nikolai messaged me today to say that the two dishwashers that he ordered before New Year were delivered today. These are catering standard dishwashers, for which he also bought some supplies, plus a stainless steel table and bucket and filters.

The equipment came within £75 of his estimate of the cost, with a further £200 for the supplies, so he has spent all the money received for this project (from yourselves, from other supporters in Scotland and from the Slavanka trust).


The worship group are also to investigate the possibility of running Messy Church. If you want to be involved in any of these projects please let me know and I will put you in touch with the appropriate people.

We are working hard, as I write this. This will be the last set of accounts Shona has to work on, having decided to take a break from calculators, spreadsheets and cheque books!! Can I, on everyone's behalf thank her for all she has done as Treasurer in Newhaven. Behind the scenes she has quietly brought our accounts up to date and modernised our approach in how we operate. I know I'm grateful for the support she has given us all, and me in particular.

Moving ahead, if you are either a Gift Aid donor or have a freewill offering envelope you may have received a letter from me. If you are a Gift Aid donor I need to know if you still pay tax — and if you aren't a Gift Aid donor, but do pay tax, would you consider becoming one!! If you are neither, but would like to know more, please email me, or see me on Sundays, and I can provide more detail. Last year alone we managed to recover £18,667 from HMRC. All of which helps us to keep our finances in good shape and to enhance

God's work not only here in Newhaven, but elsewhere in the world. It would be good if you were able to join the scheme.
